MusiXploitation is a series of movie posters that exist only in the hearts of rabid fans. In the late 1990s, Master P released narrative films with the same titles as his albums, which were a kind of fictional precursor of Lemonade with a serious dialogue. This new series is a glimpse at the world where the practice caught on with the entire music industry. Created by artistic director David Redon of Paris, the series features blaxploitation-style posters for songs and albums by Amy Winehouse, 2Pac and Jay-Z.
