(Version 11.0.01) I think Adobe is trying to control the ability to use previous versions, making it harder to get a full installation. Frankly, no disrespect was intended, I'm not sure I would entrust a third party repository when the official is available. I agree Osman. I used the Adobe FTP website and found what I needed. Unfortunately, after I installed the old version of Reader, I didn't properly disable the update service and someone updated to the latest version first thing this morning. It again broke that downgrade fixed yesterday. It seems the update service needs to be changed from the DAT file to prevent it from reactivating itself. I found this on Adobe's website: Unplugging Automatic Updates Application Manager (en) IT Administrators Installing Adobe Reader is a two-step process. First, you download the installation package, and then install Adobe Reader from that package file. Make sure your system meets the minimum requirements of the system before you install it. Choose the operating system, language, and reader version you want to install. Then click Download Now. When asked whether to open or save the file .dmg, select the Save File and then click OK. Important: If you don't see this dialog, another window can block it. Try moving any other windows to the side. Double-click .dmg file. If you don't see the download window, select the tools Download. If the download package doesn't appear in the Download window and the Thank you screen stays visible, click click Link to the Thank You screen.
